Syllabus

The class web site contains the syllabus, maps, other course materials, and announcements. There is also a discussion board so you can post questions for me, for the TAs, and for your fellow students on the readings, lectures, and discussions in section.

Every week I will post questions and items pertaining to the lectures. I invite you to post comments or ask questions about these items. These posted materials will be the basis of the final exam.
