**Paper 1**

Essays are due at the beginning of lecture on **Monday, April 17<sup>th</sup>**. The paper should be a minimum of 5 full pages in length (no more than 7) in the Humanities format.\* A *counterargument* is required.

Respond to one of the following prompts:

1. Does Vergil present a world in which rational order ultimately triumphs over passions, or a world in which the continual violence of disruptive passions makes rational order impossible?
2. According to Christine de Pizan (14<sup>th</sup> century), the story of Dido and Aeneas shows that women are much more constant and reliable than men. How right or wrong is she in reading the story this way?

Submit your paper to your TA in a plain manila folder with your name on the tab. Include all your previous Humanities papers in the folder.

Before submitting a paper copy at lecture, you must submit an electronic copy to [www.turnitin.com](http://www.turnitin.com) for text-similarity review.
