  - Targeting individuals with prior removal and deportation orders, but are receiving reports of people without prior orders are being reported

  - They are proposing a 4% increase to housing rates. I will pass out a form that compares the differential rates of UCSD's single/double/triple with all the other UC's. They found that UCSD is one of the lowest.

- Diversity engagement career advisor (105k)

- Student Retention and Success:

  - a. Create more diverse students studying STEM
  - b. UC system lost CAMP grant funding- CAMP was directed towards URM
  - C. Looking to expand CAMP to women?
- ✤ Student Success Coaching
  - a. Focus on URM, lower quintile schools
  - b. Close advising with deans and deans of student affairs
  - **C.** New program, about 400 students invited to program, 85% met with coach
  - d. 20% of cohort are below a 2.0, about 8% of students from all of univ get below 2.0
  - e. 80% got above 2.0
  - f. Small portion of students who didn't visit also did well, looking for correlation
  - g. Turn students into peer coaches
  - h. Expansion of program, adding coaches --> double amount of students served

- Sharron (director of UCEN active as AVC) came in to talk to UCAB. She was hoping that we would consider extending the Round Table lease for 1 year so that the construction planning for the space can be made while still earning money, and so two spaces will not be closed at the same time (Round table and Pub).

  - I will also be meeting with Justin Pennish, the AS Financial Controller, tomorrow to discuss the issues that exist with the Triton Food Pantry, and talk about things that can be done to help the Food Pantry.

#### VIII. <u>New Business</u>

- A. Pierre Ouillet
  - Vice Chancellor and Chief Financial Officer
  - \$5 billion budget
    - Around half goes towards medical/health systems
    - Around 20% goes towards research grants (\$1billion)
      - a. One of highest in nation ( $\sim$ 6th in USA)
      - b. Second in UC Research funding, after UC San Francisco
  - ~\$1 billion in operating income
    - ✤ Income from tuition
    - ✤ Income from state (~7%)
    - Investment income, as well as land
      - a. Involved in diversification of income
    - These income goes towards professors, IT, utilities, etc.
    - 70% of expenses are for people, and increases yearly
      - a. As result of inflation and raises for individuals
    - ✤ He focuses on increasing revenue to match increase in costs
    - Research costs are relatively flat
    - Tuition has been constant for several years
    - Offset losses with increased out of state
      - a. Out of state is  ${\sim}22.6\%$  total population . Berkeley and UCLA are  ${\sim}25\%$
      - b. Out of state does not displace in-state students
      - c. Every 1% decrease, will decline \$10 million in revenue
  - Auxiliary Units
    - ✤ ~\$180 million for Housing, dining, hospitality costs
    - Bonds are great rates, so part of reason why spending and building so much
    - Bookstore, parking, etc are other auxiliary units
  - Responses to questions
    - Trying to lower faculty:student ratio
    - ✤ Advertisement: Source of fundraising revenue
      - a. Typically fundraise \$150 million dollars, more recently closer to \$200 million
      - b. Don't have as established of an entity compared to more established campuses, so aids in that
      - c. Benchmark is not to spend more than \$0.20 than you raise, and we typically hit \$0.16
      - Moving to Division 1 effect
        - a. None, it's self funded with fee, including inflation and financial aid
    - ✤ ⅓ of Tuition and fees all return to aid

- Aggressive infrastructure plan to accommodate buildings, lecture halls, etc
  - a. Adding ~1500 students a year in all areas
  - b. Cost of educating student is  $\sim$ \$20,000 a year
- Transportation Income
  - Source from parking, pays for mortgages for structures, shuttles
  - New parking structure, parking should pay for it
  - If building displaces parking lot, building has to pay for parking
- B. Mark Cunningham
  - Runs Housing Dining and Hospitality
  - General Overview
    - Since based on college system, provide flat and balanced rates throughout the school
      - a. No price differentiation between new and older housing, like it is at many other schools
    - Undergrad housing is one budget, dining is one budget, faculty staff housing is one budget, grad housing, and grad dining are all separated
    - Pay for residential life, RA's, services
    - Has worked with student advisory committees for decades, and open to input
  - Breakdown of Budget
    - ✤ Mortgage is the largest amount of budget
      - a. 30, 40 year loans
    - Labor is second
  - Biggest challenge is demand
    - Trying to meet guarantees
    - Off campus market is very hot. Bad for students
      - a. Trying to purchase properties
    - ✤ Each college has ~2000 beds, aiming for this standard
  - Cheaper dining
    - Having multitude of dining halls makes it expensive and difficult
  - Believes in Student Employees, utilities,
    - Pay highest wages in the UC System
    - For every dollar of wage paid, school pays additional \$0.51-\$0.56
    - Provides great services and help, but also expensive
  - Policy for Student Art
    - ✤ Interested in expressing student life and interest through art
    - If interested in participating, or know anyone, please let him know
  - Working with Uber and Lyft to see if can receive a UC Reduced rate
  - Worked hard on Amazon store
    - ✤ 600,000 packages processed in a year costs a lot
    - Amazon store provides a lot of benefit
