Steps	Description	
Step 1: Enrollment Window	Confirm what your appointment times are using WebReg	
Step 2: Holds	Check for any holds on your account and resolve them	
Step 3: Academic History	Review your academic history (see below)	
Step 4: Degree Audit	Review your degree audit (see below)	
Step 5: Virtual Advising Center	Check for messages from your college and major advisors about your degree requirements	
Step 6: Academic Plans - Transfer Plan	Review the sample Transfer Plan (see below)	
Step 7: Academic Plans - College and Major Notes	Review the notes from your college and major department on the Academic Plans site for the Transfer Plan (see below)	
Step 8: Plan Courses	Plan courses in WebReg (see below)	

<p>Academic History</p>	<p>Use the following checklist to review your academic history:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Confirm all of your transfer coursework is posted correctly: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Verify all courses are listed <input type="checkbox"/> Verify grades are accurate <p>Reminder:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Maximum of 105 lower division transfer units allowed towards graduation requirements ● Community college courses are lower division courses
<p>Degree Audit</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Review your degree requirements (Degree Audit) <input type="checkbox"/> Confirm transfer coursework is being applied correctly (Academic History) <input type="checkbox"/> If you have any questions or concerns about the transferred coursework, contact your major or college advisor via the Virtual Advising Center (VAC). <p>Reminders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● You may need to petition for course equivalency with the department offering the course ● You may need to petition for a course substitution with your major department ● Check Assist.org for course articulations/course equivalencies ● Check AP chart and IB chart for UCSD credits
<p>Academic Plans</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Review sample academic plan for your intended major (Academic Plans) <input type="checkbox"/> Review the notes from your college and major advisors <input type="checkbox"/> Do you have all of the credits that the Transfer Plan assumes you have? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> If not, you will need to add those to your personalized long term plan <input type="checkbox"/> Do you have some of the courses listed in the sample plan? If yes, do not plan to take those courses
<p>Plan Courses</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Find and "Plan" course sections using WebReg <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Do not enroll in courses you already have credit for (including AP/IB credit, transfer credit, etc.) ○ Confirm your meet course prerequisites and course requirements ○ If your transfer coursework is not posted, do you need to submit a course clearance request? (Enrollment Authorization System, EASy) ○ Look for course schedule conflicts between out of class midterms, finals, etc. for courses ○ IMPORTANT: Instructors are not required to make accommodations if you enroll in courses with overlapping course components; so we do not recommend enrolling in courses that you cannot attend all course components

Plan and enroll in courses using [WebReg](#)

- Find and "Plan" course sections using WebReg
 - Do not enroll in courses you already have credit for (including AP/IB credit, transfer credit, etc.)
 - Look for overlaps between out of class midterms, finals, etc. for courses
 - IMPORTANT: Instructors are not required to make accommodations if you enroll in courses with overlapping course components; so we do not recommend enrolling in courses that you cannot attend all course components
- Enroll in 12-16 units when your enrollment window opens (up to 11.5 units during 1st pass; up to 19.5 units 2nd pass, 22 units start of classes; watch video about [Two Pass Enrollment System](#))
- It's good to have a backup alternative class too in case your preferred courses fill up
- Depending on your transfer coursework and seat availability, you may need to enroll in a general elective (the units count towards your 180 unit graduation requirement or 60 upper division unit requirement, but not towards a specific major or college GE requirement)
