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 - TLDR: The Guardian –independent student-run newspaper that serves as a full UCSD department– is in a dire financial crisis and is facing closure at worst or major restrictions in their work at best. This is because they cannot sustain their current financial model –running ads in their newspaper and on distribution boxes. They are seeking a \$3.50 per-student per-quarter fee to achieve the following:

- Pay their editors and writers more equitably for the large workload they do
- Enhance operations
 - ◆ They distribute the newspaper from an old shopping cart right now
- Rehire a professional staff member to advise The Guardian
- Print more pages in their issues and return to weekly distribution, (current is biweekly)
- Fee must be passed before elections begin, GPSA will vote next Monday, AS timeline is undecided but desire is to move quickly

- ❖ SHWAB Meeting (2/14) -> DENSE with Info (im so sorry)
 - CAPS Comprehensive Immersive Care Program
 - Relatively new program (as of a few weeks ago!)
 - In hopes to be an early intervention approach for students who are going through a crisis, about to go into a crisis, or recieving intensive care for their mental health
 - Is a student centered ecosystem with collaborations with campus partners (Craft Center, UCSD Academic Affairs, OSD, HDH, HPS, Rec Center, etc)
 - Students would remain enrolled whilst receiving this care to maintain their ability to achieve their academic goals and also keep their connection with friends/support systems to avoid isolating the student
 - Barriers to mental health
 - Transportation: How would the student be transported when/if they are going into a crisis?
 - Impact on academic schedule: How can they support a student, giving them intensive care, whilst also not affecting their academic schedule (financial aid disbursements and general academic achievements)
 - Fear of jeapordizing housing: ^^following the above topic and financial aid that is based upon units
 - "No time to waste": Because the quarter system is fast-paced, the thought of "not having time" to receive treatment may stop students from reachinhg out
 - Points of Contact (within 7 days)
 - Protocol: Call CAPS (if closed, urgent care providers who are licensed clinical therapists answer the call)
 - CAPS Urgent Care
 - CAPS Intake
 - Triton Core (which will be mentioned in a bit!)
 - Crisis Stabalization Unit
 - CMHP (College Mental Health Program: Offers more intensive therapy, groups, and psychiatric care (is off campus but is very close!))
 - Off Campus Therapist (to continue treatment but at a less intense state)
 - 3 Months Later- CAPS Wellness Check
 - Program Overview:
 - Skills Based Group: 3hrs/week, open group, CBT, DBT,ACT, and Trauma Informed Care
 - Individual Therapy: 1hr/week, Crisis Stabilization
 - Self Guided Tech: 1 hr/ week, Willo, Headspace, etc.
 - Behavioral Activation: 1 hr/week, Craft Center, Rec Center, Tritons RISE
 - CIC Inclusion Criteria (in the last 3 months)
 - Thoughts of suicide (from no intention to actual planning)
 - Self-Harm (urges/no medical attention needed)
 - Trauma (traumatic event, recent trigger, or returning of

- symptoms)
- Academic Decline w/ feelings of hopelessness/little to no sense of belonging, burdensome
- Extra Mentions:
 - The CIC collaborates with UCSD Housing to not jeopardize student's housing. And the CIC works with OSD to help with classes/accommodations
 - In the CIC program, students will be enrolled at least part time, so the student will still be in classes (assignments/exams)
 - Concern was brought up: difficulty to get accommodations (with OSD and faculty) therefore students rely on profs empathy (causing a barrier/detterant for students to reach out)
 - ♦ However it was also mentioned that CIC will have a connection w/ OSD to expedite accommodations
 - Students may keep their full time status with financial aid protection too. A typical Intensive Outpatient Program is 9 hrs. The CIC is 6 hrs so that students do not have to drop, for the most part, to part-time status.
 - If anyone has any suggestions, questions, concerns, or ideas for improvement to the program, let me know!

> Triton CORE

- Purpose/Goal
 - Provide mobile crisis response: For students who are going through a crisis and need to be taken to emergency services/safety
 - Access for student well-being and safety
 - Reduce visits to ED: to reduce escalation (slow things down)
 - Facilitate de-escallation: ^^
 - Provide a person-centerd response: Get to know the student in need rather than a generalized protocol (whilst doing risk assessment)
 - Reduce risk of arrest
- Service is Mon-Fri, 10am-10pm
- Services in English, Spanish, Cantonese, and Mandarin
- Contact: UCPD Non-Emergency- (858)-534-HELP (4357)
- Estimated response time: 30-40 min (which is fairly quick for what they want to achieve!)
- Set to add on 3 new clinicians!
- Responds to
 - Suicidal Ideation/Self Harm (no immenent risk)
 - Consultation for unique cases
 - Alcohol and/or Substance use related concerns
 - Major changes to appetite, sleep, and class attendance
 - Disoriented, delusional thinking, mania, or unusual behaviors
 - Homocidal ideation/Threat (no imminent risk)
- Services include:
 - Consultation
 - ◆ Triaging appropriate tiered response model
 - ◆ Review student eligibility for care
 - Wellness Checks
 - ◆ In-person wellness check
 - ◆ Safety Planning
 - ◆ With ROI, coordination of care
 - Mobile Response
 - ◆ Provide transportation to the ED/ CSU
 - ◆ With ROI, coordination of care
 - Postvention
 - Psychological first aid to impacted student(s)
 - ◆ Linkage to campus resources

- Concern brought up:
 - Students who do not have UC Ship, but rather their guardian's/family insurance could risk a breach of confidentiality if the student does not want their family to know about the usage of this service
 - ◆ They are currently working with UC and CSU to find a solution to this, but they did mention that they would advocate for the student on their behalf to family (to avoid harm/retraumatizing/triggering student)
- All is funded with student fees
- Student Mental Health Services Fee Revenue and Expenses
 - Created by students in 2020 (mental health fee)
 - Funds:
 - 13 positions in CAPS (Full Time)
 - 2 positions in HPS
 - 29% goes to Fin Aid to offset impact on students
 - Rest goes to SHWAB Cluster
 - Budget Breakdown (Fiscal Year 23-24):
 - Student Mental Health Fees (\$35.71/student): \$4,333,326
 - 29% to FinAid: \$1,256,579
 - Total SHW Resources: 3,076,746
 - Compensation Expenses
 - ◆ CAPS Positions: 3,109,666 [12.8 FTE, 4.8 Social Workers, 8.0 Psychologists]
 - ♦ HPS Positions: 219,697 [2.0 FTE Health educators]
 - Non-Compensation Expenses:
 - ◆ CAPS: 33,462
 - ♦ Health Promotion Services: 3,635
 - ◆ Campus Assessment Costs: 53,151
 - Total SHW Expenses 3,419,612
 - Net Position: 342,866 (deficit was covered by balance of prior year balance)
 - SHWAB Voting Decision
 - They spoke about a potential vote for the next meeting as they are looking to increase the student fee by 4% (+1.49/quarter = \$38.63/quarter/student)
 - Why 4%?: Any increase larger than that would require a full student referendum vote and SHWAB is limited to a max increase of 4% annually
